CFAB: Bill Hilts Sr.

1. There is a CFAB meeting in Albany next weekend October 1st & 2nd~
2. Seneca White Deer - The proposed project needs our help to let everyone know what it is all about. Public tours are available the weekends of October 21st. & 22nd and October 28th & 29th For information and registration for tours go to the website: www.senecawhitedeer.org
3. HSUS has merged with the Doris Day Animal League and added 130,000 more members. In 1996 HSUS Budget was 42 million dollars. in 2006 their budget was 103 million dollars and growing.
4. Animal rights groups are suing to end trapping in Minnesota. They contend trapping is destroying endangered species - lynx, bald eagles and wolves.
5. In British Columbia animal rights groups are suing to teach their message in public schools.
6. Michigan has ballot issue in November to ban hunting of doves. The latest word is "It doesn't look good for the hunters"
7. Anti's plan now is to go after individual issues in each state. In New York they are looking at bow hunting.
8. Bill is no longer associated with the TRCA - The Theodore Roosevelt conservation alliance. They are being funded by the Pew Foundation, which funds anti-hunting groups.

Region Nine Fish and Wildlife Board: Greg Tessmann - No report

NYS Conservation Council: Meeting of September 15-17, 2006

- 1.] Dale reported on the results of the elections of the six 2006 New York State Conservation Council Resolutions.
 - A. Passed 06-1 Livingston County - Any fisherman or women with a valid NYS fishing license, boater or non-boater, be allowed to utilize the State Park launch site areas with no fee attached.
 - B. Tied 06-2 Livingston County - Eliminate the distinction between hand lines and tip-up and allow each individual to have a maximum of seven lines in service at any one time.
 - C. Passed 06-3 Yates County - Prohibit the sale of all freshwater fish and fish parts caught while using a recreational license, except for baitfish.
 - D. Failed 06-4 Sullivan County - The NYSDEC develop a simple reporting questionnaire on the NYSDEC website which could be filled in by a licensee to report taking certain game species by every licensee at the end of each season. We oppose mandatory reporting.
 - E. Failed 06-5 Steuben County - Provide qualified non-ambulatory persons with hunting, fishing and trapping licenses at a reduced fee of \$5~. Good idea to keep fee at \$5~ so we get money from Pittman Roberts bill.
 - F. Failed 06-6 Madison County - Change DEC regulations that would deny bow/muzzle loader harvest of antlerless deer in DMUs where there are no DMPs issued.
2. Dale reported on the budget: A. \$50 million will be spent on Open Space. B. \$15 million will be spent on the Stewardship Program. C. \$3 million will be spent on Ocean and Great Lakes Initiative. D. \$5 million will be spent on fish hatchery modifications. E. There will be 15 new jobs in Stewardship and 10 new jobs in Conservation.

3. Gerry Bennett read a letter from Harold Palmer stating he will send out a voting form to members to get their opinion on issues the council does not have a policy towards. Gerry held elections on the latest policies. A. NO Are you in favor of a visible fishing license?
 - B. **NO** Do you favor a surcharge on outdoor equipment with the surcharge money going to the conservation fund?
 - C. **NO** Should we allow the Federal Government to license our salt~water anglers and keep the money?
 - D. **YES** Should New York State require all anglers who fish salt water to purchase a regular fishing license that would include salt water and fresh water fishing for all waters of New York State, without increasing the current license fee?

S.C.O.P.E.: Bill Mudge

1. Bill passed around a copy of SCOPE's 2006 Legislative Report. There are more than 14 pages of bills we are reviewing. The highlighted bills need to be watched or are on the move. New information is in red. If a bill comes out of a committee we oppose and goes to the floor we send out alerts to members.

 - D. \$5 million will be spent on fish hatchery modifications.
 - E. There will be 15 new jobs in Stewardship and 10 new jobs in Conservation.
